Ltd and maternal aunt Mrs. Damber Kumari Rokka, who is a Biometric Operator in Sunrise Polyclinic and Diagnosis Centre Pvt. Ltd. My parents got divorced in the year 2015, since then I have got full support from my maternal family in all aspects.

Regarding my academic qualifications, I have completed my secondary education from Galaxy Public School Gyaneshwor, Kathmandu with a **3.60 GPA** in Secondary Education examination (SEE) in the year 2017 from the National Examination Board of Nepal. By 2019, I completed my Higher secondary school level with **CGPA 3.27** (**3.11** in grade 11 and **3.44** in grade 12) from NIST(National School Of Sciences) College, Kathmandu. After completion of my high school level, I started taking IELTS class to pursue my undergraduate degree in abroad and scored overall band **6.5**, **7.5** in listening, **6.5** in reading, **6** in writing and **6.5** in speaking which is sufficient to meet the entry requirement of the course I am planning to take.

Reasons for choosing Australia:

As I have heard from my seniors and friends pursuing their education in Australia, I started investing my time to figure out study options and scopes in Australia. For that I started to attend education fairs and surfing the internet. Websites like:

I was fascinated by the fact that not only Nepal, but the endless academic opportunities in Australia have also lured students globally. The country has the third-highest number of international students in the world just after New Zealand and Canada, leaving behind the popular educational destination like USA and UK. There are several reasons for my interest in pursuing higher education in Australia such as affordable tuition fees despite providing quality education. Achieving a globally recognized qualification in an excellent learning environment along with the safest living environment is the main feature of the Australian education system, so it can be called without hesitation the best in the world.

A complete tuition fee transparency is another reason for its educational superiority. Educational policies such as **ESOS** (Education Services for Overseas Students) act for international students by ensuring a high standard of education, facilities and other supports and services (https://www.studyinaustralia.gov.au/english/australian-education/education-system/esos-act). Australia provides around 22,000 courses through 1,100 institutions. Moreover, the degree provided by Australian University is considered better and appreciated all over the world and graduates from Australia are very successful to get the job opportunity anywhere in the world. The Australian diverse society provides the ultimate platform for the people of all cultural backgrounds to adjust very quickly and feel comfortable. People get to know the taste of various traditions, foods, art, festivals in many countries.

Thus, Australia provides the perfect blend of quality education, quality life, excellent policies and courses that has indeed motivated me to study in an Aussie university.

Why not other countries?

I too researched the educational program in other international countries. But I didn't find other countries to be as appealing as Australia for education.

USA: American universities are known to have been facing increasing crime rates, mass shooting issues, etc. which would be the last option for students like me who are seeking heaven to study. Secondly, the tuition fee in the USA is out of bounds in comparison with Australia, depending on the universities I choose. Besides this, the American university requires further

SAT preparation for admission procedure along with language proficiency which is time-consuming and not much relevant. Besides these, the next regular educational intake for the USA is august, 2020 which is equivalent to taking a gap year and wasting a year just to get admitted to a college. Therefore, based on the afro-mentioned reason, I never considered the US as a suitable education destination.

UK: The United Kingdom has a costly lifestyle and fees in comparison to Australia. Also, frequently changing rules and policies for international students bought me to deny the UK as many students from my country had returned without graduation. The British government does not take the responsibility of the institutions that are unable to provide education as per their agreement and unable to deliver the course as per enrollment agreement. Australia has made a special scheme for international students i.e. Tuition Protection Services (TPS), which will ensure that our tuition fees are secured.

Canada: Canada is also suitable among the other countries for higher education, but the huge difference in tuition fees for international students estimated by the Canadian Student Federation (CFS) is unrealistic. The weather and variation in temperature in winter are very difficult to face whereas the weather in Australia is more suitable for people like me. So, that's why Canada is not an appropriate destination for my higher studies.

Other EU countries: European countries like Spain, Italy, Germany, France, Netherlands, etc. provide quality education but I did not prefer it due to the language barrier as learning their local language is time-consuming.

So, concerning the tuition fees, learning environment, time consumption, and the quality of education I have decided to choose Australia instead of other countries for my undergraduate degree.

Reason for not choosing Nepal:

There are plethoras of reasons for not choosing Nepal for my higher studies. About my study major, Nepal lacks a variety of nursing programs as provided by the Aussies universities. Only two nursing programs i.e. B.sc nursing and P.C.L are focused in my country.

There are only four recognized universities here, namely Tribhuvan University, Pokhara University, Kathmandu University and Purbanchal University providing affiliation to institutions that offer the course related to nursing, which is quite inadequate in terms of number of prospective students each year. As the demand of nurses is increasing exponentially in the country, so do the students, and the limited good institution here are unable to accommodate all the students. This has led many students to look abroad for their education.

Furthermore, the job of the nurse is a very delicate one and comes with a load of responsibilities. It is a profession that totally deals with human welfare, the care of individuals and maintaining the quality of life. This requires very proper skill-sets and knowledge which is possible only through a practical based education system which is quite not adopted by our education system. The education system here and teaching methodology are not modernized in the universities because of the lack of ideas of synchronization between theory and practical knowledge in the clinical setting. Factors like inadequate training, limited resources and lack of opportunities for personnel management are few reasons affecting quality in nursing education. The governmental colleges lack the facilities like monitoring and assessment system, while the private colleges boast the unlikely reputation of very expensive tuition fees. Also, there are consequences of limited seats for student enrollment. Thousands of high school graduates have to compete in the standardized tests to get into a well-reputed college.

Thus for the hassle-free quality education, and to earn adequate skills, I decided to pursue my education in Australia. I believe with the education bestowed upon me at Australian Catholic University, Australia will make me capable to contribute to the growth of the nursing field in my country in the coming future.

Thus, due to the afro-mentioned reasons, I didn't opt for nursing studies in my own country.

- I am allowed to work 40 hours per fortnight.
- I must inform the university and Department of Home Affairs within 7 days of arrival to Australia and also notify if I change my address or contact details.
- I need to maintain a 50% passed the mark in each term.
- I am not allowed to change courses without the approval of the department and cannot change the institution until six months.
